Re: Behavior Treatment Committee Changes and Documentation

This memorandum serves as a follow-up to the discussions at the various Detroit Wayne Mental Health Authority Provider meetings regarding the changes for the Behavior Treatment Committee structures and the payment structure for behavior treatment plans. It was during those discussions the provider system was informed DWMHA no longer recognized “levels” for treatment plans. The DWMHA Behavior Treatment Committee will only recognize and pay for intrusive and/or restrictive behavior plans.

The intent of the Behavior Treatment Committee changes are to provide early recognition of vulnerable consumers who are exhibiting or who are at risk of exhibiting challenging behaviors and require a behavior plan that may include intermittent use of restrictive and/or intrusive techniques.

As a result, the process for implementing a behavior treatment plan for these behaviors will require, at a minimum, the following:

- All consumers receive a Crisis Plan developed by the Clinically Responsible Service Provider (CRSP) made available and accessible in MH-WIN.
- If determined the consumer will benefit from a behavior treatment plan, the rationale shall be in alignment with the requirements in the Detroit Wayne Mental Health Authority’s (DWMHA) Behavior Treatment Plan Policy (current policy).

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- A Functional Behavioral Assessment (FBA) shall be completed and included with the behavior treatment plan request. All consumers with a current, active, and approved Behavior Treatment Plan shall be available and accessible in MH-WIN.
- Each respective Behavior Treatment Committee is to submit, on a monthly basis, the committee notes to the DWMHA Quality Improvement Administrator.
- Each respective Behavior Treatment Committee is to submit, on a quarterly basis, the data logs for consumers with an intrusive and/or restrictive to the DWMHA Quality Improvement Unit.
- The billing code for Behavior Treatment Plans is H2000 and for Monitoring of Behavior Plans is H2000 TS. These are the only codes to be used for submission for intrusive and/or restrictive behavior treatment plans. Billing for non-intrusive and/or non-restrictive plans shall **not** be submitted for payment.
